- Epoxy bulbs, unlike glass, are virtually unbreakable.
- Bulbs can last from 50,000 to 100,000 hours, depending on brand and usage.
- Connect up to 20 strings without overloading.

## Plan to Enjoy the Holidays Safely

As the winter holiday season approaches, Atlantic City Electric urges caution when decorating, entertaining and heating your home. Follow the guidelines below to keep your home, family and guests safe:

- Select decorations made with flame-resistant, flame-retardant or non-combustible materials.
- Inspect for frayed sockets, loose or bare wires and loose connections.
- Never staple or nail light strings or extension cords.
- Keep trees at least three feet from heating sources.
- Stay in the kitchen while cooking and keep a working fire extinguisher nearby.
- Plug portable heaters directly into outlets or wall sockets.
- If you use candles, never leave them unattended.
- Practice a home fire escape plan and share it with your guests.
