

2006 Electricity Use Drops 6%

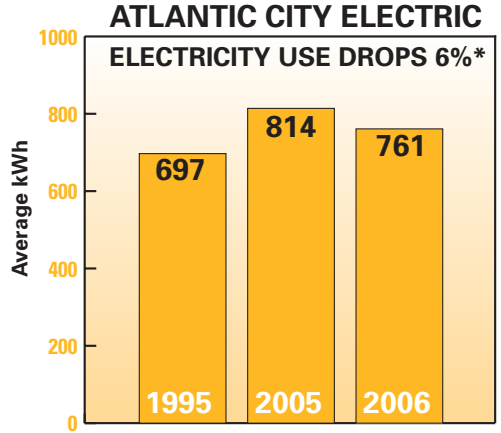
There's good news for energy conservation – Atlantic City Electric customers are doing just that. According to recent figures, our residential customers used 6 percent less electricity in 2006 compared to 2005.

Last year, the typical residential customer used 761 kilowatt-hours of electricity a month. In 2005, the typical customer used 814 kilowatt-hours a month. While overall electricity use is up considerably compared to what it was 10 years ago, it's good to see that customers are making an effort to conserve energy in their homes, resulting in a decrease in electricity use.

If you, too, want to use less electricity, here are some year-round tips for doing so:

- Wash clothes in cold water instead of hot water.
- Turn down the water temperature on your water heater to 120°F, which will save you a few dollars each month.
- Replace incandescent light bulbs with compact fluorescent ones.
- Use a microwave to cook meals, which consumes about half the energy of a conventional oven.
- Put a dry towel in the dryer with each load of wet clothes. The towel will absorb dampness and reduce drying time, saving energy and money.
- Vacuum the coils on your refrigerator at least every three months. The dirt build-up makes the refrigerator work harder to keep the contents cool and therefore uses more energy.
